Statement by Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks In Support of the Health Equity Resource Communities Proposal

I am pleased today to announce my support for legislation to be introduced by Senator Antonio Hayes and Delegates Erek Barron and Jazz Lewis to create Health Equity Resource Communities across the state which would help to reduce health disparities and improve health outcomes in disadvantaged areas. It is unconscionable that there are such large disparities in the kind of health care which Marylanders receive depending on where they live and their socio-economic status. The Health Equity Resource Communities are modeled on a very successful pilot program, Health Enterprise Zones, which improved health care outcomes in five communities between 2012 and 2016. By creating a permanent funding mechanism for this program, the new proposal makes sure these kind of health improvements can also be made permanent.

I commend the Johns Hopkins Institutions for their courageous endorsement today of this life-saving proposal. As Johns Hopkins President Ron Daniels makes clear, Maryland needs the Health Equity Resource Communities in order to address long standing health inequities in our state.
